On December 27, 1996, pursuant to an Application for Temporary Suspension made by the Chair Pro Tempore of the District Six Committee on Inquiry of the Nebraska State Bar Association, this court entered an order for attorney Terrence D. Malcom to show cause within 14 days of the service upon him of said show cause order why his license to practice law in this state should not be temporarily suspended.

On January 13, 1997, Terrence D. Malcom filed an affidavit stating that on January 8, 1997, he received a copy of the Order to Show Cause entered December 27, 1996, and a copy of the Application for Temporary Suspension. Malcom further stated that he waived service of such order and voluntarily submits to the jurisdiction of this court. The time has now expired for Malcom to show cause why he should not be temporarily suspended from the practice of law until further order of this court.

Upon due consideration of the pleadings and files in this disciplinary proceeding, this court finds that Terrence D. Malcom should be temporarily suspended from the practice of law until further order of this court.
