Appellant appeals from the order of the district court for Saline County entered on July 30, 2026, that denied postconviction relief. Appellant timely filed a notice of appeal but his poverty affidavit, filed in lieu of the statutory docket fee, is not notarized.

A proper poverty affidavit serves as a substitute for the docket fee otherwise required upon appeal. See generally, Neb. Rev. Stat. § 25-2301.01 et seq. (Reissue 2016). The 'affidavit' described in § 25-2301.01 requires the hallmarks of an affidavit such as the signature of the affiant and a certificate of an authorized officer. *State v. Haase*, 247 Neb. 817, 530 N.W.2d 617 (1995). Authentication of a poverty affidavit by a notary public and the timeliness of the document's filing are jurisdictional issues. *State v. Guardiola*, 32 Neb. App. 915, 8 N.W.3d 253 (2024).

Appellant is given 5 days from the date of this order to file a properly notarized poverty affidavit with the district court. Failure to respond shall be cause for these appeals to be summarily affirmed without further notice pursuant to Neb. Ct. R. App. P. § 2-107(A)(1).
