Mot. of Appellee for Summary Affirmance

Appellee's motion for summary affirmance pursuant to Neb. Ct. R. App. P. § 2-107(B)(2) is sustained; the district court's March 16, 2026, sentencing order is affirmed as modified. Appellant's sentences are within the statutory range and there was no abuse of discretion by the trial court. See State v. Rivera-Meister, 318 Neb. 164, 14 N.W.3d 1 (2024) (no abuse of discretion in sentence imposed when review of record shows sentencing court considered relevant sentencing factors and did not consider any inappropriate factors). However, we find plain error in the sentencing order as to time served, and we modify it to state that Appellant "is entitled to 579 days of credit for time served against the aggregate of all terms imposed." See State v. Nelson, 318 Neb. 484, 16 N.W.3d 883 (2025) (when court imposes multiple sentences contemporaneously, whether such sentences are ordered to be served consecutively or concurrently, all available credit for time served under Neb. Rev. Stat. § 83-1,106(1) (Reissue 2024) is applied just once, to the aggregate of all terms imposed).
