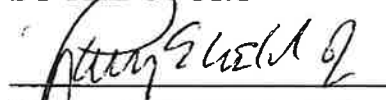

On May 29, 2026, the Appellant timely appealed from the Douglas County District Court's order denying his motion for a retrial. Further, Neb. Ct. R. App. P. § 2-105(B)(2)(b) requires the Appellant to specifically identify each portion of the evidence and exhibits offered at any hearing the Appellant believes is material to the appeal.

Appellant, having failed to seek leave or allege good cause for Appellant's untimely request, and having failed to specifically identify the evidence and exhibits requested, is ordered to show cause, within 7 days of this order, why the appeal should not proceed as if no request has been made.
