On August 26, 2026, Appellant filed a notice of appeal regarding his convictions and sentences. Appellant timely filed his request for bill of exceptions. However, on September 3, Appellant filed an amended request for the preparation of the bill of exceptions which requested an additional date not included in his original request.

Pursuant to Neb. Ct. R. App. P. § 2-105(B)(2)(f), late requests for the preparation of the bill of exceptions may not be filed "without leave of the appellate court for good cause shown, which cause shall not be within a party's reasonable control." Appellant has not requested leave of this court to file a late amended request for a bill of exceptions and has not alleged good cause for his failure to timely file the amended request for the bill of exceptions.

Appellant, having failed to request, and receive, leave of this court to file an untimely amended request for a bill of exceptions is ordered to show cause, within 7 days of this order, why the appeal should not proceed as if no amended request for a bill of exceptions had been requested.

ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

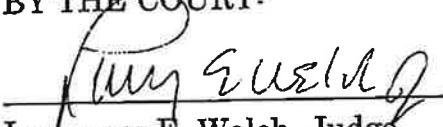
On September 8, 2026, Appellant filed a notice of appeal regarding the Douglas County District Court's denial of his successive verified motion for postconviction relief. On September 21, Appellant filed, in this court, a "Request for Bill of Exceptions."

To the extent that the Appellant's filing in this court is a late request for leave for the preparation of a bill of exceptions, pursuant to Neb. Ct. R. App. P. § 2-105(B)(2)(f), late requests for the preparation of the bill of exceptions may not be filed "without leave of the appellate court for good cause shown, which cause shall not be within a party's reasonable control." Appellant has not alleged good cause for his failure to timely file the request for a bill of exceptions.

Appellant, having failed to allege good cause for his failure to timely file the request for a bill of exceptions, is ordered to show cause, within 10 days of this order, why the appeal should not proceed as if no praecipe for a bill of exceptions had been requested.
