



1 Maintain detention for only those youth who pose a significant risk to the community or risk to flee the jurisdiction of the court.

62%

of youth, who were detained, met the criteria on the detention screening instrument.


2 A higher percentage of youth will be involved in pro-social activities including school and employment.



74%

of youth that were discharged in the last 3 months reduced their risk in the education and employment domain. The discharged youth were initially placed on probation with a high YLS/CMI score for education and employment and have reduced their risk related to those key areas by the end of the probation term.

3 An increase in status youth who are diverted from the juvenile justice system or who receive a decreased term of probation supervision.



Status youth spend 27.8% less time on probation than delinquent youth.



4 Increase use of community-based services while reducing use of out-of-home placements.



73%

of youth are supervised while at home. The remaining 27% are supervised in out-of-home placements, on September 30, 2021.



In the last 3 months

- 361 youth have accessed funds for **Community-Based Treatment** services.

- 808 youth have accessed funds for **Community-Based Non-Treatment** services.

5 Youth involved in the juvenile justice system will receive targeted supervision and services that reduce post-program recidivism.



45% of all youth released from Probation saw a **decrease** in their overall risk score.

85% of youth were **successfully** released from Probation.

Statewide Recidivism Rate



of youth that were successfully discharged from Probation, were found responsible for a subsequent qualifying adjudication within one year of their release. This current recidivism rate is reported as of September 30, 2021.

Recidivism by Risk Level

As predicted by the validated risk assessment tool, Youth Level of Risk/Case Management Inventory (YLS/CMI), the total population of low risk youth who discharged successfully between September 30, 2019 and September 30, 2020 recidivated at a lower rate than the total population of moderate or high risk youth.
