


Adult Probation Quarterly Report

Date Range: July 1 - September 30, 2020 (unless noted)

Adult Probation refers to individuals sentenced to a term of traditional probation. This excludes individuals sentenced to postrelease supervision (PRS). Any data that includes both traditional and PRS will note as such.





Statewide Recidivism Rate



of adults who were successfully discharged from Probation, were found responsible for another qualifying offense within three years of their release. This current recidivism rate is reported as of September 30, 2020. At this time, PRS cannot be separated within the recidivism data and are included in this percentage.

Recidivism by Risk Level

As predicted by the validated risk assessment tool, Level of Service/ Case Management Inventory (LS/CMI), the total population of low risk adults who discharge successfully between September 30, 2016 and September 30, 2017 (Supreme Court requires 3 years from date of release) recidivated at a lower rate than the total population of medium or high risk adults.
