

The discharged youth were initially placed on probation with a high YLS/CMI score for education and employment and have reduced their risk related to those key areas by the end of the probation term.

An increase in status youth who are diverted from the juvenile justice system or who receive a decreased term of probation supervision.



Status youth spend 29.2% less time on probation than delinquent youth.

Increase use of community-based services while reducing use of out-of- home placements.




of youth are supervised while at home. The remaining 28% are supervised in out-ofhome placements, on September 30, 2020.

Youth involved in the juvenile justice system will receive targeted supervision and services that reduce post-program recidivism.




of all youth released from Probation saw a decrease in their overall risk score. (July 1 - September 30, 2020)

Statewide Recidivism Rate



of youth that were successfully discharged from Probation, were found responsible for a subsequent qualifying adjudication within one year of their release. This current recidivism rate is reported as of September 30, 2020.



Risk/Case Management Inventory (YLS/CMI), the total population of low risk youth who discharged successfully between September 30, 2018 and September 30, 2019 recidivated at a lower rate than the total population of moderate or high risk youth.
